

F-Class Rule Highlights

F-Class is shot in the prone position using two categories of specialized rifles. For both F-Open (FO) and F-Target Rifle (FTR) categories, any safe, manually operated trigger is permitted and any sighting system is permitted. No muzzle breaks are permitted.

F-Class Open Rifle (FO)

- At PGC, bore diameter for competition is limited to .308 caliber.
- Overall weight of rifle, including all attachments, must not exceed 10 kilograms (approximately 22 pounds).
- A front rest may have up to three feet (i.e., points of contact with the ground).
- Width of rifle's fore-end shall not exceed 76mm (approximately 3 inches).

F-Class Target Rifle (FTR)

- Rifle limited to either .223 Remington/5.56mm **OR** .308 Winchester/7.62mm.
- Overall weight of rifle, including all attachments such as sights and bipod, must not exceed 8.25 kilograms (approximately 18.18 pounds).
- Rifle must be fired off a bipod, rigidly attached to the rifle's fore-end, and/or with a sling.

Both FO and FTR use designated F-Class targets identified as MR-63FC, MR-65FC, MR-1FC, and LRFC targets (for 300, 500, 600, and 800 yards, respectively).

F-Class Course of Fire (60 shots + sighters)

Each competition will generally consist of three shooting matches at one yardage and a fourth match that consist of the aggregate score of the three shooting matches.

- Match 1 - unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record in 23 minutes
- Match 2 - 2 convertible sighters and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes
- Match 3 - 2 convertible sighters and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes
- Match 4 - aggregate of scores fired in Matches 1-3
